Book Launch & Big Buck Blow-up: Victoria Woodhull's True Story Revealed

Unstoppable: The Victoria Woodhull Story

Kate Danaher, former professor of English literature at Rosemont College, will present her debut historical novel. The book chronicles the meteoric rise of Victoria Woodhull, the Homer-born suffragist who shattered glass ceilings as the first woman to run for U.S. President in 1872. Danaher will dive into Woodhull's complex legacy—including her Election Day imprisonment for obscenity—and the creative process of extracting truth from a life enshrouded in myth.

The Big Buck Blow-up

Genealogist **Mary L. Shearer**, a relative of Victoria Woodhull's second husband, Colonel James H. Blood, will present "The Big Buck Blow-up." Shearer will unveil original court records that finally overturn the 180-year-old accusation of arson against Woodhull and her father, Buck Claflin. These legal documents, never before presented to the public, provide a definitive alternative to the rumors surrounding the destruction of the Claflin mills on June 13, 1846.

Historical Significance

The event coincides with the **180th anniversary** of the Claflin mill fire. By pairing Danaher's literary perspective with Shearer's archival discoveries, the program offers a comprehensive look at the distortions caused by Woodhull's fame.
